Re: Request for Oversight - United States v. Cammarata

Dear Chairman and Ranking Member:

I am a federal prisoner seeking congressional oversight of documented institutional failures in my prosecution and appeals. This is not a request for sympathy or intervention in pending litigation. It is a request to examine why federal courts are refusing to rule on properly filed motions and appeals while ignoring binding Supreme Court precedent.

The enclosed materials document:

1. A federal prosecution premised on a legal theory directly contradicted by Sprint Communications Co. v. APCC Services, Inc., 554 U.S. 269 (2009)
2. An undisclosed conflict of interest: SEC counsel's spouse is employed in the Third Circuit's executive office, where four related appeals have stalled
3. A mandamus petition pending 11 months with no opposition filed and no ruling
4. An SEC appeal pending 21 months with the government never filing a response brief
5. The government's waiver of response to my Supreme Court mandamus petition (No. 25-6128)

The attached Congressional Oversight Request provides the narrative and legal framework. The Legal Case Spine provides the evidentiary and procedural documentation across eight related federal proceedings.

I am prepared to provide supporting documentation for every claim. I seek not mercy, but accountability for systemic failures that should concern anyone who values judicial integrity.
